
A Shrine to St. Teresa of Calcutta & Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal: "A Medal that Changed the World."

Shrines are officially defined as holy or sacred places dedicated to a specific martyr, saint, or similar figure of awe and respect, at which they are venerated or worshipped. They give us a place to learn more about God, our Blessed Mother, and many saints. Each shrine honors and focuses on a story and history, giving us a better understanding of our faith.

Vincentian Father Michael Shea, assistant director of the Central Association of the Miraculous Medal, said, "The Irish call a place that you feel closer to God' A Thin Place.' This refers to the veil between us and heaven feeling thinner, allowing a stronger feeling of God's love and graces to wrap around you like a blanket of reassurance." This is a beautiful description of a shrine where you can come, pray, lay your burdens, and feel wrapped in God's love through Mary's intercession on your behalf.

Mother Teresa of Calcutta would give Miraculous Medals to people she met when she walked this earth. On a visit by an American Buddhist Monk just before her death, Mother Teresa took 10 medals, kissed them, and gave them to him. He gave away 9 medals on his journey and kept one for himself. When he came to live in Largo, Florida, he found St. Teresa of Calcutta Catholic Community and felt his last medal needed to rest at our parish. He presented it to us in 2023.

Today, we venerate that Medal in a Shrine dedicated in August 2024 for that purpose. In addition to the Miraculous Medal, our Shrine has a large marble sculpture of St. Teresa of Calcutta, a description of the symbols of the Miraculous Medal, and a plaque of the Medal (illustrating its detail). The Shrine is open daily for prayer, and candles are present to light. We encourage all visitors to take a medal and Holy Card for Our Lady.

Shrines are not just places of learning and love but also refuge. They offer a profound sense of peace and comfort in our hectic and sometimes spiritually deprived lives. They are often associated with intercessory prayers for healing various ailments or other troubles and bring Catholics together in a community of prayer and faith. When you visit a shrine, you can leave behind the chaos of the world and find a peaceful sanctuary for your soul.




