We extend our hands and hearts in hospitality to our immigrant brothers and sisters, recognizing their inherent dignity and the many gifts they bring to our communities. We stand in steadfast support of our LGBTQI sisters and brothers, celebrating their God-given identities and embracing them fully within the life of the Church.

The ANCC rejects all forms of discrimination, oppression, and exclusion. We denounce any laws, policies, or actions that seek to divide, dehumanize, or marginalize individuals based on their identity or circumstances. In the spirit of the Good Samaritan, we pledge to be a voice for the voiceless, a place of refuge for the displaced, and a community of radical inclusion, where all are welcomed, loved, and affirmed.

We call upon our clergy, faithful, and all people of goodwill to join us in this sacred mission—to be instruments of peace, bearers of hope, and builders of a world where justice and mercy prevail. As a sanctuary community, the American National Catholic Church will continue to walk with those who seek safety, embrace those who long for acceptance, and advocate for the dignity and rights of all God's children.
